Journalling a Journey with Jesus — Creative Prayer Retreat

at Llangasty Retreat House — Monday to Friday, 8-12 July 2024

I led this retreat with a small group in order to test the waters. It was considered by all to be a great success and I would very much like to offer it to other retreat houses next year. Here's a summary of the week along with the feedback received.

Each day started with morning prayer, had an art session and a meditation, mid-day prayer, free time in the afternoon and evening prayers including an examen.

Monday afternoon and evening was a time of settling in and introducing the week. I gave a talk

about my journey of journalling along with the journals for people to see the progression of my skills and art from the mid 1980s' simple beginnings through to more complex current work.

Having listened to the fears around doing art, Tuesday started with a warming up exercise of playing with acrylic paints. They wanted to learn how to do the woven ribbons and the small journals. It was a lot, but they were keen to learn and soaked up

Wednesday was PLAY DAY and saw us playing with watercolours to see how they behave in various degrees of wetness of paper and amount of water. Blowing paint, stencilling and pattern making were greatly enjoyed.

We made prints from leaves and cling film. I used mine to show how they can make a picture.

The meditation was Godly Play followed by a mindfulness painting exercise done prayerfully.

I blew bubbles to lead the examen during evening prayer.

On **Thursday** we did mandalas, both free hand and structured. The meditation was Lectio Visual on a painting of the feeding of the 5,000.

Our final session on Friday morning used creative writing to help participants to review the week.
